He pointed out that young people in Gabon have shown little interest in the agricultural sector, hence the sector is dominated by ageing men and women who operate at minimum scale. This, according to him, is a result of young people's mentality that they cannot make a livelihood in agriculture. He added that the country has come to realize that it needs to act fast in ensuring that the youth change their mindset to "secure the agriculture sector."

"We need to convince the young people that they can make a livelihood outside of administrative/government jobs, but because they are impatient and agriculture requires a lot of patience, they run away from it. It is important to engage the youth and encourage them to return to the land, because that is the foundation of development," he stated.

Speaking on how to engage youth in agriculture, Sanginga explained about

the IITA Youth-in-Agribusiness model. He related how IITA started with a pilot group of about 30 young people and changed their orientation about agriculture. He said that although this took some time through the incubation program, many of them now own and operate private agribusiness enterprises.

He added that the program, which started with a small group in Nigeria, is now being replicated across Africa.

Sanginga also gave an overview of research at IITA, including recent developments in cassava and the work that IITA is currently carrying out in Togo. He expressed the need to get Gabon engaged and the need for their financial support. He added that IITA is ready to assist and has the technical resources to start supporting agricultural development in the country.

The Head of the TAAT Clearing House, Mpoko Bokanga, also gave an overview of the TAAT program.

Gabon's Minister of Agriculture, Biendi Maganga-Moussavou, who was also part of the meeting, was very excited about partnering with IITA and TAAT, especially regarding the youth program. He emphasized the need for providing technical training for the youth agribusiness programs.

## **IITA receives award at Nigerian Risk Awards**

<u>IITA</u> was among the awardees at the 2018 Nigerian Risk Awards (NRA) held on 6 September in Lekki, Lagos. The Institute was represented by members of its Risk Management Committee (RMC) including Rasheed Fagbenro, Kayode Awobajo, and <u>Sylvia Oyinlola</u>.

Speaking on the selection and assessment process, NRA co-chair Tunde Popoola noted that this year, the award recipients were able to provide evidence of implementation and demonstrate actual value provided by the organizations' risk management programs. process is merit driven and a new metric was introduced to attest the evidence of success made by organizations."

# Forest Center commemorates meeting of Nigerian conservation body with tree planting ceremony

<u>IITA</u> and the <u>Nigerian Conservation Foundation</u> (NCF) have long-standing relationships, covered by a memorandum of understanding, to strengthen conservation activities of the <u>IITA</u> <u>Forest Center</u> (FC) in Ibadan. Thus, the National Executive Council (NEC) of NCF held their board meeting at IITA Headquarters, Ibadan, on 6 September to discuss issues relating to biodiversity conservation and forest restoration.

According to the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO), Nigeria lost an average of 47.5% of its forest cover between 1990 and 2010. In an effort to address this situation, the FC organized a tree planting ceremony to commemorate the NEC meeting. The ceremony was attended by IITA management staff and guests from the Oyo State Ministry of Natural Resources, University of Ibadan, Commonwealth Forestry Association of Nigeria, College of Forestry, Ibadan,

Olive Branches School, and Centre for Environment, Renewable Natural Resources Management and Research.

Speaking on behalf of IITA, <u>Hilde Koper-Limbourg</u>, Deputy Director General, Corporate Services, welcomed the participants, saying, "It is a great honor to have you in our midst. I am very pleased to see that you are interested in piloting the protection and conservation of our ecosystem, and I encourage you

all to synergize efforts to preserve the full range of Nigeria's biodiversity."

Chief Izoma Asiodu, President, Board of Trustees, NCF, appreciated IITA for hosting their meeting. "IITA has not only dedicated its resources in the preservation and restoration of forest cover but has also worked with partners to ensure that Nigeria's forest cover is not completely depleted. I must confess, there are few places like IITA in Nigeria!"

Commending IITA for its conservation agenda, Chief Ede Dafinone, NEC Chairman said, "Based the on development that I have seen in IITA, it is obvious that knowledge exists in the institute. I congratulate IITA for its level of expertise, especially in the area of nature conservation." The Founder of the Ogbudu Conservation Center, Onari Duke, expressed her deepest conviction that the continued information and resource sharing between NCF and IITA "will reinforce and deepen our commitment to promote the conservation of natural resources for the benefit of present and future generations." She also emphasized the need for the development of a comprehensive reforestation strategy.

FC Manager Adewale Awoyemi briefed participants on the center's activities and efforts on forest restoration. He highlighted the importance of sustainable development while emphasizing the need to enhance biodiversity conservation and education.

In his vote of thanks, the Director General of NCF, <u>Dr Muhtari Aminu-Kano</u>, applauded the participants for their support and also encouraged them to work in their different capacities to ensure that forest cover is restored in Nigeria.

Thereafter, participants proceeded to the IITA FC Tree Heritage Park where the NEC members planted nine indigenous tree species, three of which are listed as threatened on the International Union for Nature Conservation Red List of Threatened Species. During the planting, FC interns read out a brief description of each tree.

The ceremony also featured a tour around IITA and the FC nursery, bird watching, and a musical rendition by students of Olive Branches School, who are members of the FC School Conservation Club.
